

Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014

**North Somerset District Council (Area Wide) Public Space Protection Order
2017**

1. This Order may be cited as the North Somerset District Council (Area Wide) Public Space Protection Order 2017
2. This Order shall commence on the date it is made and cease to be of effect on the 20 October 2020
3. This Order applies to the public spaces specified in Schedule 1 and imposes restrictions as set out in Schedules 2 and 3.
4. It is an offence for a person, without reasonable excuse:
 - (a) to do anything a person is prohibited from doing by schedule 2 of this order, or
 - (b) to fail to comply with a requirement to which the person is subject by schedule 2 of this order
5. A person guilty of an offence under condition (a) or (b) of article 4 of this order, is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale or fixed penalty notice of a maximum £75.
6. It is an offence for a person, without reasonable excuse to fail to comply with a requirement imposed by schedule 3 of this order
7. A person guilty of an offence under article 6 of this order is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale or a fixed penalty notice of a maximum of £75

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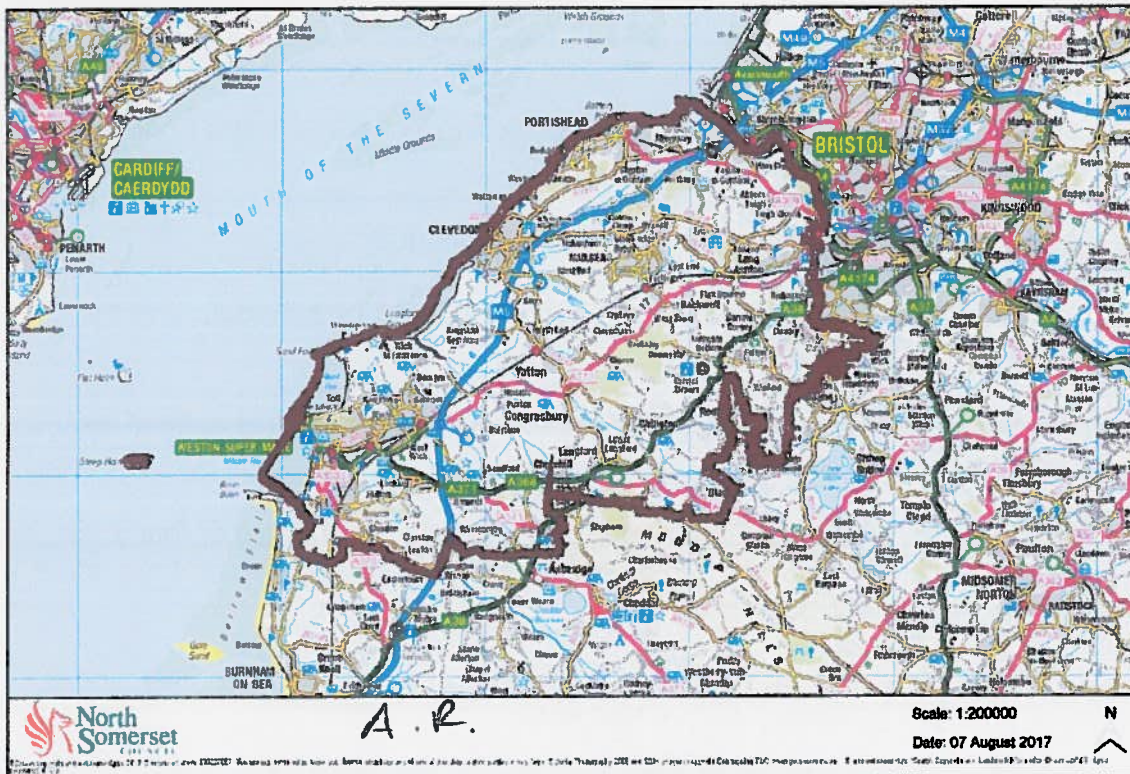


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Schedule 1

Public spaces within North Somerset District Council falling within the following categories

Any public space in the open air and to which the public is entitled or permitted to have access (with or without payment) within the boundary of North Somerset, delineated for identification purposes only on the map below



Schedule 2

Restrictions

- (1) No person in charge of a dog shall fail to remove dog faeces, unless
 - (i) the person is registered as a blind person in a register compiled under Section 29 of the National Assistance Act 1948, or
 - (ii) the person has a disability which affects his mobility, manual dexterity, physical co-ordination or ability to lift, carry or otherwise move everyday objects in respect of a dog trained by a prescribed charity and upon which he relies for assistance
- (2) No person in charge of a dog shall fail to produce a receptacle for picking up dog faeces when requested to do so by an authorised officer, unless

(i) the person is registered as a blind person in a register compiled under Section 29 of the National Assistance Act 1948, or

(ii) the person has a disability which affects his mobility, manual dexterity, physical co-ordination or ability to lift, carry or otherwise move everyday objects in respect of a dog trained by a prescribed charity and upon which he relies for assistance

(3) No person in charge of a dog shall fail to put a dog on a lead when directed to do so by an authorised officer.

(4) No person shall deposit litter

(5) No person shall urinate or defecate

(6) No person shall trade goods on public property, unless

i) the person has a valid pedlars licence, or

ii) the person has valid street trading consent / license

(7) No person shall fail to stop consuming or inhaling anything in their possession which an authorised officer reasonably believes to be a psychoactive substance, as defined by section 2 of the Psychoactive Substances Act 2016, when required to do so

(8) Without prejudice to the generality of paragraph 7 above, no person shall fail to stop consuming or inhaling anything in their possession which an authorised officer reasonably believes to be nitrous oxide when required to do so

(9) No person shall fail to surrender anything in their possession, which an authorised officers reasonably believes to be a psychoactive substance as defined by section 2 of the Psychoactive Substances Act 2016, and associated paraphernalia, when required to do so

(10) Without prejudice to the generality of paragraph 9 above, no person shall fail to surrender anything in their possession which an authorised officer reasonably believes to be nitrous oxide, and associated paraphernalia, when required to do so

Schedule 3

(1) No person shall fail to stop consuming alcohol when required to do so by an authorised officer, unless

(i) the person is consuming alcohol within the boundary of

(a) premises (other than council-operated licensed premises) authorised by a premises licence to be used for the supply of alcohol;

(b) premises authorised by a club premises certificate to be used by the club for the supply of alcohol;

(c) a place within the curtilage of premises within paragraph (a) or (b);

(d) premises which by virtue of Part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 may at the relevant time be used for the supply of alcohol or which, by virtue of that Part, could have been so used within the 30 minutes before that time;

(e) a place where facilities or activities relating to the sale or consumption of alcohol are at the relevant time permitted by virtue of a permission granted under section 115E of the Highways Act 1980 (highway-related uses).

(ii) the person is consuming alcohol within the boundary of

(a) council-operated licensed premises—when the premises are being used for the supply of alcohol, or

(b) within 30 minutes after the end of a period during which the premises have been used for the supply of alcohol.

(2) No person shall fail to surrender anything in their possession which the authorised officer reasonably believes to be alcohol or a container for alcohol when required to do so.
